LEADERSHIP REPORT

Whilst COVID-19 has certainly had a lasting impact on society, it was vital that Judo WA had strong support from the wider judo community. Throughout the past year it has been delightful to see the increased number of events being held throughout Western Australia as well as registration numbers beginning to reach pre-pandemic levels.

In particular, over the last 12 months, Judo WA has been excited to host the 2021 Perth International Open, 2022 Fuel to Go & Play Judo WA State Championships, and XVIII Australian Masters Games. It has also been promising to see traction for our two participation programs: the Fuel to Go & Play Judo in Schools initiative and Fuel to Go & Play Judo Kickstart Judo Training Sessions.

Throughout the 2022 financial year, Judo WA welcomed three new member clubs including The Arena MMA Judo Club in Rockingham, Broome Judo Club, and Kalgoorlie PCYC Judo Club. With the addition of these new clubs, it is exciting that judo is now found in 6 out of 9 WA regions.

Each year Judo WA presents a series of awards celebrating the achievements of our Western Australian athletes and recognising the contributions made by members of the WA judo community. Unfortunately, due to

venue restrictions earlier in the year, we were unable to host our 2021 Awards evening. This small hurdle presented a fantastic opportunity to instead recognise our 2021 Award winners at the 2022 Fuel to Go & Play Judo WA State Championships in front of fellow athletes, coaches, volunteers and families whom make up our WA judo community. Congratulations to all the 2021 Judo WA Award recipients!

Several members of our Western Australian judo community were also recognised by Judo Australia's No Limits Committee for their involvement in special needs judo. Casey Dunn (Santos Judo Academy) was awarded the Spirit of Inclusive Judo award for her continued determination and dedication to the sport of judo as a competitor and role model. Simon Read (SouthWest Judo Academy) was awarded the Service to Inclusive Judo award for his excellence in coaching and contribution to the growth and promotion of No Limits Judo in Western Australia. Two members and one member club were also presented with the Excellence in Inclusive Judo award: Wayne Phipps (Kano Judo Schools) for outstanding representation of his country and sport at the 2020 Paralympic Games in Tokyo and ongoing promotion of judo for visually impaired judoka; Robert Girdwood (Kano Judo Schools) for embodying the principles of judo and his ongoing skill development and

achievements in judo at training and high-level competition; and SouthWest Judo Academy for the development of an inclusive, fun and nurturing environment that provides excellence in coaching and opportunities for No Limits students. Congratulations to our WA recipients!

On the tatami, our WA judoka have displayed resilience in spite of significant periods of restriction and the resulting impact that has had on the competition landscape in Western Australia.

Our significantly larger State Team comprising 89 unique athletes (54 in 2021) and 141 entries (75 in 2021) returned home from the 2022 National Championships on the Gold Coast with 22 gold, 27 silver, and 26 bronze medals, for a total of 75 medals – 32 more medals than in 2021! Congratulations to all our athletes and their respective clubs and thank you to our WA State Coaches, Senseis Luc Tournier, Carlo Knoester, Celeste Knoester, Shane Rigby, Kota Nagamura, and Catia Maia.

An aside from the competition aspect of the National Championships, we would be amiss if we did not recognise and congratulate Sensei Carlo Knoester (Kano Judo Schools) on his promotion to 7th Dan by the National Grading Committee.

Added to WA's results at the National Championships, our WA athletes found success throughout Judo Australia's entire National Event Series – a year-round competition circuit that comprises the Australian National Championships as well as state-hosted 'International Opens' with events held in the Australian Capital Territory, Gold Coast, New South Wales, South Australia, Victoria, and Western Australia. In total, our athletes collected 79 gold, 77 silver, and 57 bronze National Event Series medals. Congratulations to all our athletes on such a fantastic achievement!

The strength and success of WA judoka is not confined to Australian competition. Throughout the 2022 financial year, Western Australian athletes were represented 22 times with 10 individual athletes being selected across nine National Teams to represent Australia at high-calibre international events. We would like to acknowledge and congratulate the following athletes for their selection and success at the national level: Calvin Knoester, Maria Swan, Rihari Iki, Jordon Greenbank, Wayne Phipps, Timeo Tournier, Kimi Jost, Vas Middleton, and Saya Middleton. Notably, Judo WA would also like to congratulate Maria Swan and Calvin Knoester – WA's two Combat Australia and Judo Australia categorised athletes.

Arguably one of the most significant achievements from a Western Australian judoka throughout the previous 12 months, we must recognise the achievement of Wayne Phipps (Kano Judo Schools) for his selection and participation at the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games. Wayne has been a champion at State and National level and continues to be an inspirational role model in our community. Congratulations Wayne on a remarkable achievement!

What a sensational year of judo we have had in Western Australia.

Acknowledging that ours is an emerging sport still heavily reliant on volunteers, Judo WA wishes to express its gratitude to all the people who give up their time, energy, and expertise. From coaches, to referees, to administrators, volunteers keep our sport running. Thank you for all that you do.


Specifically, Judo WA extends its sincere gratitude to the amazing, hardworking people on our various committees – Simon Read, Marlee Mickle, Celeste Knoester, David Smith, David Robinson, Jacob Read, Carlo Knoester, Melissa Dennehy, Paul Kendrick, Robert Tichelaar, and Patrick Tichelaar.



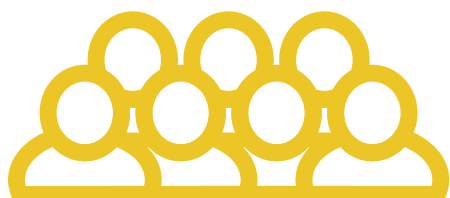
through and through supporter of judo in WA and we are the luckiest that he is one of our own.

2022 Fuel to Go & Play Judo WA State Championships

The Fuel to Go & Play message was promoted throughout our 2022 State Championships event, which attracted over 400 players, coaches, volunteers and spectators..

Fuel to Go & Play Kickstart Training Sessions

The Fuel to Go & Play message was further promoted throughout our Kickstart Training Sessions held throughout the 2022 financial year. The sessions, aimed at participants aged 5 to 16, is designed to offer all Judo WA members and primary school-aged children

the opportunity to come together and share information and techniques through games and training sessions.

Our Fuel to Go & Play Kickstart Training Sessions attracted approximately 350 participants, coaches, and spectators throughout the 2022 financial year.

Fuel to Go & Play Judo in Schools

The Fuel to Go & Play message was promoted through the delivery of Judo WA's schools program – an introductory judo program combining fun and physical activity for children where participants learn fundamental judo techniques, terminology and values, including friendship and respect.

Throughout the 2022 financial year, the Fuel to Go & Play Judo in Schools program was delivered to over 900 students from 5 schools.

The grant will also provide Judo WA the capacity to deliver sporting opportunities to increase the level of female engagement in judo throughout Western Australia.





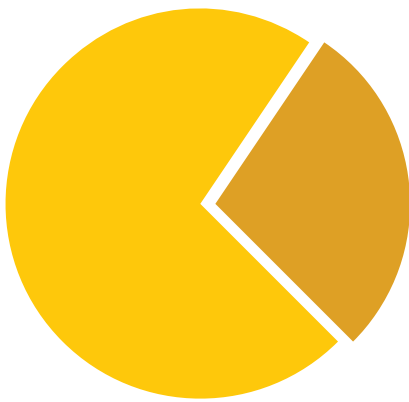
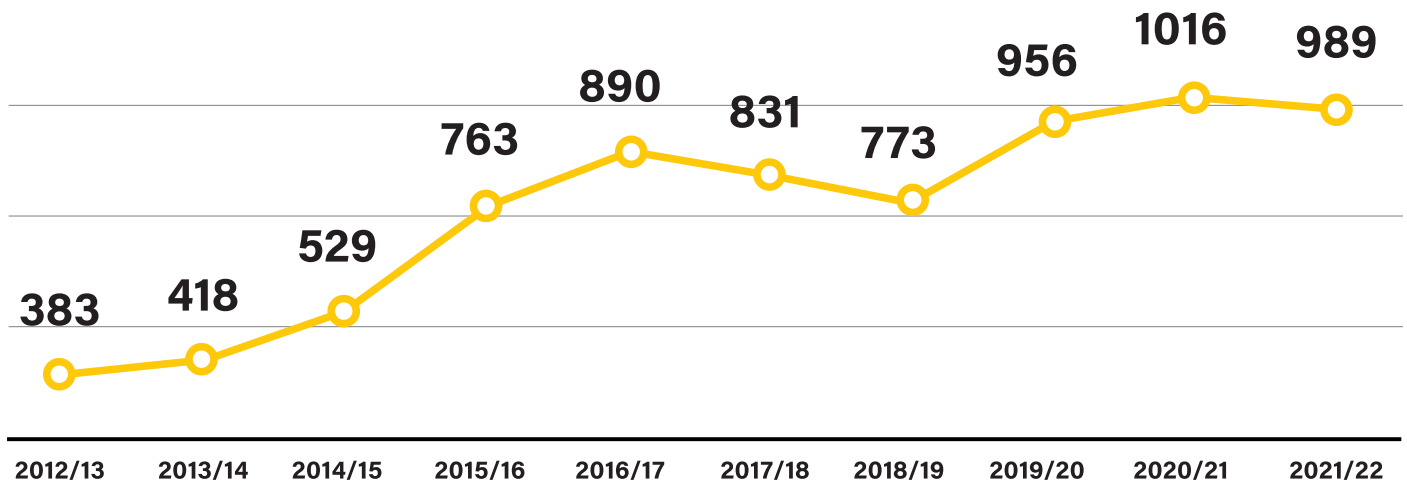

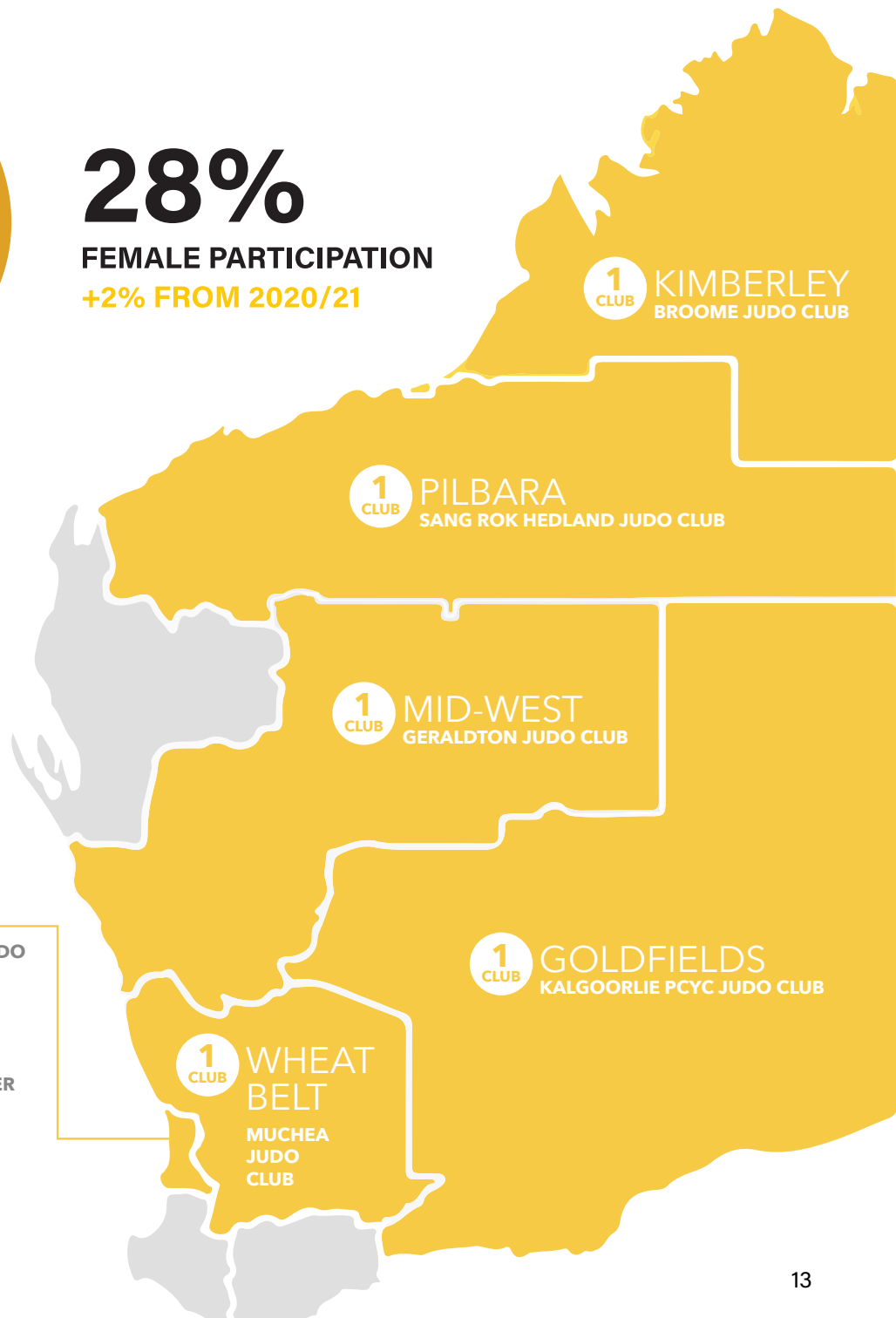

EVENTS

Judo WA Hosted Tournaments

2021 Perth International Open

Despite easing travel restrictions in and out of Western Australia, our 2021 Perth International Open event attracted a largely local crowd, with only 19 of the 170 participants hailing from outside of Western Australia.

2022 Fuel to Go & Play Judo WA State Championships

Our 2022 Fuel to Go & Play Judo WA State Championships event attracted 177 participants, 24 officials, and over 200 spectators.

XVIII Australian Masters Games

After numerous postponements due to the pandemic, Perth played host to the eighteenth iteration of the Australian Masters Games. Similar to the 2021 Perth International Open, the travel implications of the pandemic led to the event attracting only a local crowd of approximately 20 participants.

Club-Hosted Events

In addition to events hosted by Judo WA, several of Judo WA's member clubs hosted a number of events open to the wider WA judo community. These included:

SouthWest Judo Academy

SouthWest Judo Academy hosted their annual SouthWest Judo Championships with over 170 competitors across 50 divisions.

Santos Judo Academy

Santos Judo Academy hosted the Bendigo Mundaring Go PINK to BELT Cancer fundraising event. Coordinated alongside clubs across Australia, over 300 participants took to the tatami to spread awareness of breast cancer

Elite Judo Club

Elite Judo Club hosted their Beginner's Senior Judo Tournament open to white, yellow, and orange belt participants with 23 entries and 44 matches.

Other Events

Fuel to Go & Play Kickstart Training Sessions

Introduced in 2021 amidst the COVID-19 pandemic, Judo WA's Fuel to Go & Play Kickstart Training Sessions attracted approximately 350 participants, coaches, and spectators.

Dan Grading Workshop

A new initiative in 2022, Judo WA delivered its first Dan Grading Workshop to prospective applicants with the intention of providing guidance and transparency on the dan grading process.

Refereeing Seminar & Table Official Course

Targeted towards beginner and experienced officials, Judo WA's Refereeing Seminar and Table Official Course attracted over 40 participants.

State Training

In preparation of the 2022 National Championships, six state training sessions were hosted by a number of our member clubs with club coaches assisting the State Coaches in delivering the sessions.

The 2022 state training sessions attracted 86 participants.

Western Australian judo is growing stronger with each year that passes.
